The commission form of government was first used in Sangamon County. Three commissioners and the sheriff were elected. The commissioners, Rivers Cormack, William Drennan and Zachariah Peter, were then responsible for appointing other county officials like the treasurer, justices of the peace, constables and road supervisors. Another duty of the commissioners was to locate a site for a temporary courthouse. A spot in the field of John Kelly was selected, which was today located near the northwest corner of Second and Jefferson streets.

A man named Elijah Iles made a decision to move to Sangamon County. He located the future spot of the courthouse and arranged for a storehouse to be built nearby. Iles plan was to operate a store until the time came for land sales to begin. He would go on to become one of the founders of the city. Mann concluded his program by suggesting three books for people interested in reading further about the early history of the area. The History of the Early Settlers of Sangamon County by John C. 
